Her career spans film, television and Web production, and this summer she made her first foray into feature film, serving alongside producing partners Steven Spielberg and Oprah Winfrey on "The Hundred-Foot Journey," starring Academy Award-winner Helen Mirren.

Blake has worked in every genre of television and built successful TV franchises in the U.S. and U.K. Formerly a senior executive at the National Geographic Channel in Washington, D.C., she oversaw development and production of NGT, National Geographic's in-house production company, including content for Emmy Award-winner "Explorer," the longest-running documentary series on cable.

As president of Jim Henson Television in Los Angeles, California, Blake was responsible for all prime time and children's television and had global oversight of the Muppets franchise. She developed and produced the Muppets' first TV movie and steered science fiction fan favorite "Farscape" on the Sci-Fi network, executive producing the final 33 episodes of the groundbreaking, award-winning series.

Peck studied theater and film at the University of Southern California, and earned a Bachelor of Arts in speech communications and rhetorical studies from Hofstra University.





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
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Savannah's Favorite Desserts and Cocktails






Other credits include 2011's "Damsels in Distress," 2013's "Warm Bodies" and the upcoming "Mississippi Grind."
