

WILL ARNETT

TUESDAY, OCT. 28 | 9 P.M. | LUCAS THEATRE FOR THE ARTS

Will Arnett has built an impressive career that spans television, movies, podcasts, commercials, and more. He is the co-host of the immensely popular podcast SmartLess with close friends Jason Bateman and Sean Haves. Arnett burst onto the scene in the Emmy Award-winning sitcom Arrested Development, which earned him his first Emmy nomination in 2006. He also famously guest-starred on NBC's beloved 30 Rock, receiving four additional Emmy nominations. His other TV credits include BoJack Horseman, Flaked, The Millers, Up All Night, Running Wilde, Riviera, The Increasingly Poor Decisions of Todd Margaret, Snake Oil, Murderville, Lego Masters, and Twisted Metal, Arnett has starred in dozens of hit live-action and animated movies, including *The* Lego Movie, Lego Batman, Blades of Glory, Semi-Pro, Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles, Ratatouille, Monsters vs. Aliens, and many more. In collaboration with Bradley Cooper, Arnett is co-starring, writing, and producing the feature film Is This Thing On? A mainstay in the advertising world, he has been the voice of GMC Trucks, Reese's Peanut Butter Cups, and Bank of America. In 2014, Arnett launched his production company, Electric Avenue, which develops and produces content across all platforms.



HANNAH BEACHLER

MONDAY, OCT. 27 | 10 A.M. | LUCAS THEATRE FOR THE ARTS

Hannah Beachler is a renowned production designer with an affinity for evocative designs and visuals. Beachler made history as the first African American to be nominated for and win an Academy Award for production design for her work on the Marvel Cinematic Universe's Black Panther, directed by frequent collaborator Ryan Coogler. She returned for its highly anticipated sequel, Black Panther: Wakanda Forever, which collectively grossed more than \$2 billion. Beachler previously collaborated with Coogler on Creed and Fruitvale Station, the director's feature film debut and Sundance Film Festival Grand Jury Award and Audience Award winner, and recently reteamed for his latest film, the critically acclaimed box-office smash Sinners. Beachler's other film credits include the Best Picture Oscar-winning Moonlight, No Sudden Move, Dark Waters, and The Collaboration. She most recently completed production on *Children of Blood and Bone*, shot on location in South Africa. Multihyphenate global icon Beyoncé also called on Beachler to be the production designer on the visuals for her musical film Black Is King, her mega successful On The Run II Tour, and her stunning visual concept album *Lemonade*. Beachler has received two Art Directors Guild Awards and an Emmy Award nomination.



CRAIG BREWER

THURSDAY, OCT. 30 | 6 P.M. | TRUSTEES THEATER


Craig Brewer is renowned for his gritty and music-driven storytelling beginning with his breakout hit Hustle & Flow, which was produced and financed by his late mentor John Singleton. Brewer's film premiered at the Sundance Film Festival and earned an Academy Award for Three 6 Mafia's "It's Hard Out Here for a Pimp," making them the first hip-hop group to win a Best Original Song Oscar, Brewer followed *Hustle & Flow* with the Southern blues fable Black Snake Moan and a remake of Footloose. He returned to the director's chair in 2019 with Dolemite Is My Name, which marked the return of megastar Eddie Murphy. The film won the Critics' Choice Award for Best Comedy and earned Murphy a Golden Globe Award nomination. Brewer and Murphy continued their collaboration with the long-anticipated sequel Coming 2 America in 2021. On TV. Brewer has directed episodes of The Shield, Terriers, Empire, and Fight Night: The Million Dollar Heist, which he also executive produced. Brewer's next film, Song Sung Blue, about two down-on-their-luck performers who form a Neil Diamond tribute band, is scheduled to open on Christmas Day.



ROSE BYRNE

MONDAY, OCT. 27 | 2:30 P.M. | TRUSTEES THEATER

Rose Byrne is an Emmy Award and Golden Globe Award-nominated actor who continues to captivate audiences with her tremendously diverse body of work. Byrne is best known for her award-nominated work on the drama series Damages and her role in Paul Feig's Bridesmaids, which earned Golden Globe and Screen Actors Guild nominations. Her other film credits include *Teenage* Mutant Ninja Turtles: Mutant Mayhem, Spirited, Instant Family, Peter Rabbit, Insidious, Neighbors, Spy, Annie, This Is Where I Leave You, The Internship, The Place Beyond the Pines, X-Men: First Class, Get Him to the Greek, 28 Weeks Later, Sunshine, Marie Antoinette, Wicker Park, and Trov. Byrne most recently starred in If I Had Legs I'd Kick You, receiving the Silver Bear for Best Lead Performance at the 2025 Berlin International Film Festival. On TV, she has appeared in *Platonic*. *Physical*, and the upcoming limited series *The Good* Daughter — all of which she also executive produced — as well as Mrs. America and The Immortal Life of Henrietta Lacks. Additionally, Byrne has starred on stage on Broadway and in her native Australia, earning nominations for a Drama League Award and a Drama Desk Award.



MILES CATON

MONDAY, OCT. 27 | 10 A.M. | LUCAS THEATRE FOR THE ARTS

With his blend of artistic versatility, actor and musician Miles Caton has emerged as one of the most exciting and promising new voices in entertainment. Caton gained global recognition for his breakout role in Ryan Coogler's blockbuster hit *Sinners* for Warner Bros, starring alongside an all-star cast in his acting debut. The 20-year-old Brooklyn native first garnered national attention in 2017 after performing Nina Simone's "Feeling Good" in a viral video, leading to appearances on NBC's *Little Big Shots*, *The View*, and Jay-Z's short film *4:44*. In 2022, he toured with Grammy Award winner H.E.R. as a background vocalist, during which the artist encouraged Caton to audition for *Sinners*. Despite having no prior acting experience, he landed the role and learned how to play guitar for it in two months. In addition to acting, Caton continues to build his music career. He released his debut single "This Ain't It" in 2023 and co-wrote the original song "Last Time (I Seen the Sun)" for *Sinners* alongside singer-songwriter Alice Smith and Academy Award-winning composer Ludwig Göransson.



PARK CHAN-WOOK

SATURDAY, OCT. 25 | 9:30 P.M. | LUCAS THEATRE FOR THE ARTS

South Korean film director, screenwriter, and producer Park Chan-wook is among the most acclaimed auteurs in the world. Chan-wook is perhaps best known for his Vengeance Trilogy, consisting of *Sympathy for Mr. Vengeance*, *Oldboy* — winner of the Cannes Film Festival's Grand Prix — and *Sympathy for Lady Vengeance*. His other films include the Cannes Jury Prize winner *Thirst*, *Stoker, The Handmaiden*, and the Cannes Best Director winner *Decision to Leave*. His most recent film, *No Other Choice*, won the coveted International People's Choice Award at the Toronto International Film Festival. On TV, Chanwook directed and executive produced the BAFTA-winning limited series *The Little Drummer Girl*, adapting the John le Carré novel for the BBC and AMC. He also served as co-showrunner for HBO's *The Sympathizer*, an adaptation of the Pulitzer Prize-winning novel of the same name. Chan-wook produced the internationally acclaimed *Snowpiercer*, directed by Bong Joon-ho, and served as executive producer for the recently concluded TV series. He also produced and co-wrote the critically acclaimed Netflix film *Uprising*.



JON M. CHU

SUNDAY, OCT. 26 | 3:30 P.M. | LUCAS THEATRE FOR THE ARTS

Director Jon M. Chu is known for his visually stunning blockbuster films as well as his kinetic work across various genres. His unique storytelling ability has earned him recognition on lists like The Hollywood Reporter's Power 100 and Variety's New Hollywood Leaders. Chu most recently directed Universal Pictures' critically acclaimed Wicked, starring Academy Award-nominated actors Cynthia Erivo and Ariana Grande. The film, which released in November 2024 and guickly became the highest-grossing Broadway musical adaptation in box office history, also garnered an Oscar nomination for Best Picture. Chu is currently in post-production on the sequel. Wicked: For Good, which will release in November 2025. Chu also directed the musical adaptation In the Heights and the worldwide phenomenon Crazy Rich Asians, which earned Screen Actors Guild Award and Golden Globe Award nominations. His other credits include G.I. Joe: Retaliation, Now You See Me 2, and Justin Bieber: Never Say Never. Chu will next direct adaptations of Britney Spears' memoir The Woman in Me and Dr. Seuss' classic Oh. The Places You'll Go! In 2024. Chu also released the memoir Viewfinder, which chronicles his journey from growing up in Silicon Valley to helming major studio projects in Hollywood.



ZOEY DEUTCH

SUNDAY, OCT. 26 | 7 P.M. | TRUSTEES THEATER

Zoey Deutch has steadily and boldly built her body of work with dynamic roles as both an actor and producer. Deutch can currently be seen in Richard Linklater's Nouvelle Vaque, the critically acclaimed look at the making of French film classic *Breathless*, and the romantic comedy *The Threesome*, which she also produced. Her film credits include Juror #2, Not Okay, Something from Tiffany's, The Outfit, Buffaloed, Zombieland: Double Tap, Set It Up, Flower. The Year of Spectacular Men, Rebel in the Rye, Before I Fall, Everybody Wants Some!!, Why Him?, Dirty Grandpa, and Beautiful Creatures. On TV, she also starred in Ryan Murphy's Golden Globe Award-nominated Netflix series The Politician. In 2024, Deutch made her Broadway debut as Emily Webb in the Tony Award-nominated production of Our Town, winning Favorite Featured Actress in a Play for the role at the 2025 Audience Choice Awards. Deutch will next star in Jan Komasa's thriller *Anniversary*. She is currently in production on Netflix's Voicemails for Isabelle and recently wrapped production on David Wain's Celebrity Hall Pass, where she executive produced the film and starred opposite Jon Hamm and John Slattery.



JOEL EDGERTON

TUESDAY, OCT. 28 | 4 P.M. | LUCAS THEATRE FOR THE ARTS

Joel Edgerton is an acclaimed Australian actor, writer, and filmmaker. Born in New South Wales and an alum of the Nepean Drama School, Edgerton first drew international attention as Owen Lars in *Star Wars: Episode II* and *Episode III*. Since then, he has built a versatile career across film, television, and stage. Edgerton has collaborated with directors like Ridley Scott, Ron Howard, David Lowery, and Jeff Nichols, maintaining a dynamic presence across global cinema while remaining deeply connected to Australian storytelling. His film credits include *The Great Gatsby, Zero Dark Thirty, Warrior, Black Mass, Loving* — which earned him a Golden Globe Award nomination — *The Boys in the Boat*, and *The Gift*, his directorial debut. He also co-wrote Netflix's *The King* and produced the documentary *Daughters*, which won a Peabody Award and the 2024 Sundance Film Festival's Audience Award. Most recently, Edgerton starred in the Apple TV+ series *Dark Matter* and Charlie Polinger's film *The Plague*. He will next star opposite Felicity Jones in Clint Bentley's adaptation of *Train Dreams* and in Netflix's limited series *Boy Swallows Universe*.



DAKOTA FANNING

SATURDAY, NOV. 1 | 12:30 P.M. | TRUSTEES THEATER

Dakota Fanning garnered her first Emmy Award, Golden Globe Award, and Critics' Choice Awards nomination for her magnetic performance in Netflix's critically acclaimed adaptation of *Ripley*. Fanning's extensive film credits include The Cat in the Hat. Man on Fire. War of the Worlds. Uptown Girls. Dreamer, Charlotte's Web, The Secret Life of Bees, The Last of Robin Hood, Coraline, The Twilight Saga, Brimstone, Night Moves, Please Stand By, Once Upon a Time in Hollywood, The Watchers, and The Equalizer 3. Fanning was the youngest actor to be nominated for a Screen Actors Guild Award, earning it for her performance in 2001's I Am Sam. On TV, Fanning has appeared in The First Lady, The Alienist, The Perfect Couple, and Vicious. She will next star in Peacock's highly anticipated thriller miniseries All Her Fault alongside Sarah Snook, In 2020. Fanning and her sister Elle formed Lewellen Pictures to develop feature film and television projects as well as other forms of media. including podcasts. Through Lewellen, the sisters produced the Emmy Awardnominated documentary Mastermind, Hulu's award-winning series The Great, and the limited series The Girl from Plainville.



BRENDAN FRASER

WEDNESDAY, OCT. 29 | 7 P.M. | TRUSTEES THEATER

Brendan Fraser is an Academy Award winner whose nuanced performances and compelling role choices have earned widespread acclaim. Fraser won the Best Actor Oscar for his role in Darren Aronofsky's *The Whale*, among other honors. Fraser is best known for his role in Universal's billion-dollar *The Mummy* franchise, starring as Rick O'Connell in a trilogy of films based on the 1932 horror classic. Since his breakout in 1992's *Encino Man*, Fraser has starred in the films *Brothers*, *Killers of the Flower Moon*, *No Sudden Move*, *Line of Descent*, *The Nut Job*, *Gimme Shelter*, *Escape from Planet Earth*, *Extraordinary Measures*, *G.I. Joe: The Rise of Cobra*, *Crash*, *Bedazzled*, *Gods and Monsters*, *George of the Jungle*, *Airheads*, *With Honors*, and *School Ties*. On TV, Fraser has starred in *Doom Patrol*, *Trust*, *Condor*, *The Affair*, *Texas Rising*, and *Scrubs*. In 2010, Fraser made his Broadway debut in the comedy *Elling*, based on the Norwegian novels by Ingvar Ambjørnsen. Fraser will next star in the films *Rental Family* and *Pressure*, where he will portray Dwight D. Eisenhower, and will lend his voice to the upcoming animated series *Breaking Bear*.



MARK HAMILL

WEDNESDAY, OCT. 29 | 12 P.M. | LUCAS THEATRE FOR THE ARTS

Mark Hamill is a BAFTA and Emmy Award-winning actor whose face and voice have graced screens for over 40 years. Hamill is best known for his portrayal of Luke Skywalker in the original Star Wars movies, a role he has reprised in the film sequels and the TV series The Mandalorian and The Book of Boba Fett. He has also appeared in the films Kingsman: The Secret Service, The Machine, and Brigsby Bear. Hamill's extensive voice acting work includes the Academy Award-nominated The Wild Robot, the Oscar-winning The Boy and the Heron, and a longstanding role as the Joker across more than 30 years of Batman media. On the small screen, Hamill recently appeared in Sandman, The Dark Crystal: Age of Resistance, What We Do in the Shadows, and Mike Flanagan's The Fall of the House of Usher. Hamill was most recently seen in two film adaptations of Stephen King works: The Long Walk and The Life of Chuck, reteaming with Flanagan for the latter film. His upcoming projects include The SpongeBob Movie: Search for SquarePants, where he will voice The Flying Dutchman.

THURSDAY, OCT. 30 | 8:45 P.M. | LUCAS THEATRE FOR THE ARTS

Oscar Isaac is a Golden Globe Award-winning and Emmy Award and Screen Actors Guild Award-nominated actor, producer, and musician whose enthralling performances have earned him a devoted fan base and critical acclaim. His film credits include Inside Llewyn Davis, A Most Violent Year, Ex Machina, the recent Star Wars sequel trilogy, The Promise, Operation Finale, Triple Frontier, At Eternity's Gate, The Card Counter, Dune, and Spider-Man: Across the Spider-Verse. His recent TV projects include Moon Knight, Scenes from a Marriage, and Show Me a Hero, the latter of which earned him a Golden Globe. In 2019, Isaac created his production banner Mad Gene Media alongside writer and director Elvira Lind. Their first project, the short film *The Letter Room*, received a Best Live Action Short nomination at the 2021 Academy Awards. In addition to film and TV. Isaac has a prolific history on stage. In 2023, he starred alongside Rachel Brosnahan in the revival of Lorraine Hansberry's *The* Sign in Sidney Brustein's Window. Isaac will next star in Guillermo del Toro's highly anticipated adaptation of Frankenstein. His upcoming projects include the second series of Netflix's acclaimed Beef, the new series Stowaway, and the film In the Hand of Dante.



RIAN JOHNSON

Rian Johnson is an Academy Award-nominated filmmaker known for *Knives Out*, *Glass Onion*, *Looper*, and *Star Wars: The Last Jedi*. A graduate of University of Southern California's School of Cinematic Arts, Johnson directed four short films before making his feature directorial debut with *Brick*, starring frequent collaborator Joseph Gordon-Levitt. Johnson has also directed the film *The Brothers Bloom* and episodes of *Terriers* and *Breaking Bad*, winning a DGA Award for his work on the latter series. Johnson has received Oscar nominations for Best Original Screenplay and Best Adapted Screenplay for *Knives Out* and its sequel *Glass Onion*. Through his company T-Street, Johnson has co-created the hit series *Poker Face* for Peacock and executive produced the series *3 Body Problem* as well as the films *Fair Play* and the Oscar-winning *American Fiction. Wake Up Dead Man*, the third part of his *Knives Out* trilogy, is his latest film.

Cassandra Kulukundis is an esteemed casting director and partner in Unison Films. She has worked extensively with filmmaker Paul Thomas Anderson, most recently on his acclaimed *One Battle After Another* starring Leonardo DiCaprio, Sean Penn, Benicio del Toro, Regina Hall, Teyana Taylor, and Chase Infiniti. Her previous work with Anderson includes the films *Licorice Pizza*, *Phantom Thread*, *The Master*, *There Will Be Blood*, *Punch-Drunk Love*, *Magnolia*, and *Boogie Nights*. In 2015, she received the Film Independent Spirit Awards' Robert Altman Award for her work casting Anderson's *Inherent Vice*. Kulukundis has also cast such lauded films as Brady Corbet's *The Brutalist* and *Vox Lux*, Spike Jonze's *Her*, David Mamet's *Spartan*, Terry Zwigoff's *Art School Confidential* and *Ghost World*, Danny Leiner's *Harold & Kumar Go to White Castle*, Billy Ray's *Breach* and *Shattered Glass*, and more. In addition to casting, she has also produced several films, among them *Vox Lux*, *The Disappearance of Eleanor Rigby* trilogy, *The Greatest Hits*, *A Late Quartet*, *The Elephant King*, *Jailbait*, and more.



SPIKE LEE

TUESDAY, OCT. 28 | 12:30 P.M. | TRUSTEES THEATER

Academy Award winner Spike Lee's iconic body of storytelling has made an indelible mark on film and TV. Lee's career spans over 30 years and includes She's Gotta Have It, School Daze, Do the Right Thing, Jungle Fever, Malcolm X. He Got Game, Summer of Sam, She Hate Me, Inside Man, Miracle at St. Anna, Red Hook Summer, Old Boy, Chi-Rag, Da 5 Bloods, and Highest 2 Lowest. A five-time Oscar nominee, he won Best Adapted Screenplay for his 2018 film BlacKkKlansman and received an Academy Honorary Award in 2015 for his contributions to film. His outstanding documentary work includes the Emmy Award-winning If God Is Willing and Da Creek Don't Rise. When the Levees Broke: A Requiem in Four Acts, the Peabody Award-winning A Huey P. Newton Story, the Oscar-nominated 4 Little Girls, and his concert film American Utopia with David Byrne. Lee is also well-known for his legendary commercial work. like his marketing campaigns with Michael Jordan for Nike. Lee is a professor of film and artistic director at his alma mater, New York University's Tisch School of the Arts. His production company 40 Acres and a Mule Filmworks is based nearby in Da Republic of Brooklyn, New York.



INGA IBSDOTTER LILLEAAS
